Mayor's message

Art and culture are vital to the Mackay region's liveability and cultural expression and is an important part of the community.

Creative communities recognise the importance of art and culture to a vibrant economy and community. Culture and cultural expression play a crucial role in reflecting and articulating community ideals, aspirations and identity. Local performances, festivals and celebrations are important ways of generating continuity and a sense of shared identity in communities, as well as providing recreational activities, and a sense of pride in the Mackay region.

Individual involvement in cultural events strengthens community networks by constructing a firm social fabric that values creativity, diversity and participation. It is acknowledged that art can create a sense of identity for the community and a unified vision for the region. Mackay is recognised as a city that fosters arts and culture, and Mackay Regional Council has made significant investment in cultural facilities and programs to ensure members of the community have a range of opportunities to engage in the arts.

introduction

definitions

To assist in interpretation the following definitions shall apply:

Art

shall mean expression through creativity: including all forms of creative and artistic expression and activity, which includes, but not limited to, public art, sonic arts, visual arts, craft and design, photography and film, video, new media and digital art, writing, performing arts (music, theatre and circus), festivals, Indigenous art, multi cultural arts or creative industries.

Culture

shall mean shared values determined by social, economic and environmental characteristics of a specific location or group. This includes, but not limited to, preservation of knowledge, stories, heritage and collections.

Creative Communities

shall mean a growing, formative, flexible, cohesive, supportive and inclusive community that facilitates the creation of a safe and vibrant place to live.

To ensure council's cultural services meet priority needs, are of high quality and are well received and accessed by residents and visitors to the region.

| Key Element 1 | Provide community and cultural venues that address priority needs, support the development and presentation of cultural products and experiences, and are well accessed and regarded by the community. |
| Key Element 2 | Provide cultural programs and services that meet priority needs, foster capacity building, creative participation and leadership skills, and are well accessed and supported by the community. |
| Key Element 3 | Host festivals and events which are well accessed and supported by the community, and which broaden community experience, involvement in and understanding of arts, culture and heritage. |
| Key Element 4 | Collect, document and present the history, stories and artefacts of Mackay's indigenous community, successive waves of migrant settlement (e.g. Maltese and Australian South Sea Islander), and contemporary culture. |
| Key Element 5 | Continue to build audiences for council's cultural facilities and programs, while also encouraging greater creative participation in cultural activities, as a catalyst for improving social cohesion, community cooperation, a greater sense of local identity and pride, and encouraging active engagement in civic life. |
| Key Element 6 | Further develop the RADF committee and program as a key strategic instrument of council for community cultural development, building positive public awareness of council's cultural services, supporting local artists into professional practice, and pro-actively reviewing and shaping ongoing cultural policy. |

Goal 2

To ensure council's cultural services are coordinated, efficiently managed and delivered, and are well integrated and/or linked into other areas of council service delivery and across the region.

- Key Element 1** Increase communication and collaborative planning and program delivery between council's cultural services and other internal departments, as well as with key community and government partners.
- Key Element 2** Initiate new joint marketing and promotion strategies across cultural and other key service areas of council.
- Key Element 3** Coordinate fundraising and earned income initiatives across cultural services and other key service areas within council.
- Key Element 4** Improve documentation processes and tracking of both qualitative and quantitative outcomes of council's cultural initiatives.
- Key Element 5** Facilitate continuous skills development and encourage a "learning" culture among council staff and community volunteers providing advisory support to council via related committees. (also relates to Goal 6)
- Key Element 6** Build the corporate profile of council's cultural services and promote departmental expertise, "IP", community networks and relationships as potential resources to other council departments.
- Key Element 7** To initiate and maintain equitable and collaborative relationships and goodwill between all cultural development partners in neighbouring councils towards mutual support and greater program integration.

Goal 3

To promote and facilitate community capacity building, leadership, networking and ongoing learning through arts and culture.

Key Element 1

Provide and facilitate the delivery of cultural information, directories, referral services and training, aimed at fostering self-help skills development, networking and improved communication within the community.

Key Element 2

Encourage and support increased community access to and usage of information technology as a key communication and capacity building tool. (This links to 1.2)

Key Element 3

Further develop the strategic role of the Arts Development Officer position as a key driver of cultural capacity building, creative community engagement and the development of local arts practice and related business.

Goal 4

To continue to build and diversify the local economy by value-adding through arts and culture.

Key Element 1

Build upon past and recent investments and further develop Mackay's reputation as a regional, state and national leader in numerous established and emerging areas of cultural development.

Key Element 2

Encourage and support both pro-am and successful businesses and entrepreneurial initiatives within the arts, heritage and cultural fields.

Goal 5

To enhance the amenity, sense of safety and unique local identity of civic and open public spaces across greater Mackay.

Key Element 1

To establish and implement a clear and coherent vision for public art and civic beautification, that reflects and enhances the unique character, assets and heritage of Mackay city and other town centres within the council area.

Key Element 2

Create outdoor environments that promote positive community interaction, support a healthy lifestyle, foster a sense of local identity and place, and encourage inter-generational exchange.

Key Element 3

Ensure the preservation, understanding and enjoyment of heritage buildings and monuments.

Goal 6

To value, encourage and support council and community volunteers.

Key Element 1

Seek out best practice models of volunteer recruitment and management and provide (or facilitate the provision of) related training for council staff and the community.

Key Element 2

Further develop and/or introduce new strategies for acknowledging and encouraging all cultural volunteers (including volunteer members of committees and boards).

Key Element 3

Provide opportunities for ongoing skills development, networking and social inclusion among council volunteers.
